CALL FOR COMMENTS: Revision of the Proposed Green Seal™ Environmental Standard for Sanitary Paper Products (GS-1)

Green Seal™ is proposing the revision of its environmental leadership standard for sanitary paper products, previously issued as tissue paper (GS-1) and paper towels and paper napkins (GS-9). Green Seal is an independent non-profit organization established in 1989 devoted to working towards environmental sustainability through environmental standard-setting, product certification, and public education. The intent of Green Seal's standards is to reduce, to the extent technically and economically feasible, the environmental impacts associated with the manufacture, use, and disposal of products. The purpose of revising GS-1 and GS-9 is to combine the standards into one comprehensive standard that evaluates the critical issues in the life cycle of sanitary paper products. In addition, the scope of the standard has been expanded to include other sanitary paper products, and to cover products for institutional as well as retail markets.

The Proposed Revised Standard is now available for public review. Accompanying this letter are two separate documents, the background document and the proposed revised standard. The public review process is a key step to involve all stakeholders in the development of this standard. Green Seal welcomes comment from all interested parties. Green Seal is soliciting suggestions and comments on these proposed revisions from diverse stakeholders, including producers, users, and general interest groups. For public review of its standards, Green Seal considers each written comment, conducts follow-up research as needed, and revises the proposed standard accordingly, with a written response to the comment or groups of comments on the issue. In Green Seal's experience, the process of commenting, discussing issues, and resolving issues is most critical for the success of a standard. Green Seal, therefore, encourages all interested parties to provide substantive comments on the proposal.

The Proposed Revised Standard is open for comment until February 23, 2009.

Comments will be submitted through an online forum system. To post comments on the on-line forum, one must register to use the forum. All users will be able to view all comments and the name of the commenter. Forum registration is open to all interested parties until the deadline. To register as a user and access the forum:

- Then post your comments in the appropriate section of the standard.
